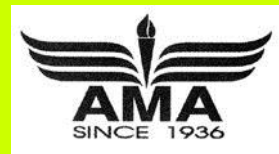

#### August Meeting Highlights

The August meeting was called to order with 23 members and guests attending.

#### Show & Tell

Chuck Hocking recommended for those of us building/repairing Depron foam models, Krylon makes an excellent paint that can be used on this material without melting it away: A few quick passes provides adequate color with minimal added weight.

Dan Kleckner described the tree landing of Bob Lindeman's Corsair on the north side of the field.

Mike Flanagan presented a slide show from the annual Lakeland RC fly in, as well as some nice video of Matt Teresinski's P-47.

Mike also showed off a wiring harness he found through [RC Universe](http://RC Universe) that combines several servo leads into one plug to simplify plane assembly at the field.

Chuck Hocking presented a guest, Jim Mertz. Jim is a current ABC member who flies Heli and fixed wing, and is interested in joining Lakeland RC.

#### Treasurer's report

Dan Kleckner reports we received \$75 in dues this month, but paid out 2 months worth of rent for the Porto-John, leaving our balance at \$3,018.49.

#### Committees

##### Fun Fly

Dan reports we had a slight net loss from the fun fly, due to settling up with the Boy Scouts early, before receiving some unexpected bills/receipts. Our net loss was \$65. It's estimated the boy scouts made about \$1,000 from food sales and around \$600 from parking. A motion was made and passed not to request the \$65 difference from the Scouts.

Todd Weiler estimated the Scouts parked around 110 cars, without relying on the

overflow parking at the entrance to the field. Fewer large trailers at the field this year helped get everyone parked close to the action.

Jerry Kettner voiced a concern that many members of the public were walking around amongst the planes on display and into tents. There was some discussion of looking into ways to restrict this in the future.

Dennis Grossklaus noted some flyers hand-launching models from the fence on the flight light. He recommended hand launchers go out at least 20 feet into the run way to reduce risk of injury if a model gets out of control on launch.

Mike Flanagan voiced a concern that some of the very young attendees at the fun fly may have learned a few new words at our field that their parents might prefer they not know, and recommended we pay more attention to our language at the field when youngsters are around.

#### New Business

Two new members were voted in: Stan and Georgia Armstrong.

Jerry Kettner reminded the membership of the upcoming cookout with Rubicon at our field on August 29th, and would bring 2 packs of brats left over from the fun fly. Dan Kleckner volunteer to bring soda.

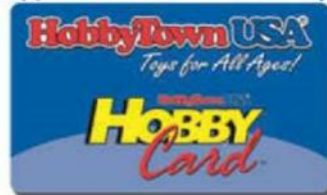
